2nd Alternate, Arkansas Legislative Council Colon and Rectal Cancer is the 4th most prevalent form of cancer in Arkansas. Statewide, there are 46 cases per 100,000 Arkansans. But for minorities, that number climbs to 64 cases per 100,000.

Rep. Fred Allen knew that Arkansas is not alone in this fight. He also knows changing these statistics will take a multifaceted approach.

That approach has to include improving access to healthcare, increasing awareness of risk factors and prevention strategies, and promoting diversity and inclusion in cancer research and treatment.

Rep. Fred Allen is a cancer survivor. He was first diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2007. What saved his life was a routine screening. Had he not had good insurance that provided him access to that screening, it's quite possible Rep. Allen would not be here to join us today.

Two years after that diagnosis, Rep. Allen was proud to sponsor what became Act 75. That legislation made sure every health insurance company in Arkansas covered the screening that saved his life.

And just this year, Rep. Allen sponsored what became Act 429. This Act requires insurance companies in the state to provide coverage for biomarker testing.

Act 429 will not only save lives but help to make those months of recovery more efficient and less painful.

At this point in our history, when political ideology seems to divide us on what we once thought were fundamental ideas, Rep. Allen feels that there should be a celebration that in our Capitol we are united in the fight against cancer.

Democrats and Republicans alike not only supported Rep. Allen's bill, but several others that have sought to prolong our years and invest in research.

Rep. Allen hopes that state capitols around the country and our nation's capitol see what Arkansas executes in the fight against cancer.


